

North Saskatchewan River: Paddling Canada's History *125th Anniversary of Riel Rebellion*

Clearwater Canoeing and Saskatchewan Parks invite you to participate in a paddle through time on the North Saskatchewan River July 10 to 20th 2010

The North Saskatchewan River was created with the time and slow toil of glaciers. When Canada was still an ice covered north with shallow oceans gently revealing a new land. With this turn in climate some of Canada's most noted waterways were cut into the earth as glacial spillways and melt water channels. Our Adventure starts here...

The trip will be nine nights of outdoor lifestyle and backcountry gourmet meals. We have designed this trip for all skill levels and ages. We will travel an approximate daily km of 16 which will give our group ample time to appreciate the experience and time to explore historical sites.

Fort Pitt to Fort Battleford -10 days and 9 nights: \$1200 per adult

The shorter versions of the trip are as follows:

Fort Pitt to the Highway 21 Bridge-3 nights and 4 days: \$400 per adult

Highway 21 Bridge to Big Gully Nature Preserve-1 night and 2 days: \$125 per adult

Fort Pitt to Gully-4 nights and 5 days: \$600 per adult

Gully to Paynton Ferry-1 night and 2 days: \$125 per adult

Paynton Ferry to Battleford- 3 nights and 4days: \$400 per adult

Children 12 to 15 are \$75 per day and Children 12 and under are \$50 per day

These are the "come and go" packages based on shuttle distances and access points to the river. Clearwater is incorporating different themes for each section and for the whole trip to appeal to every age group and to incorporate all aspects of the river.
